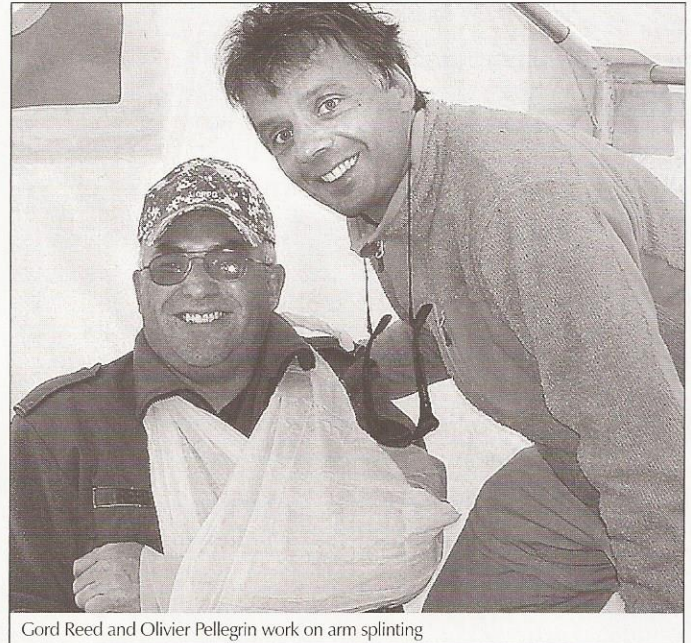

Yukon Emergency Measures Organization and its partner in SAR, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, are dedicated to saving lives by providing the training and support necessary to conduct Yukon search and rescue operations with maximum cooperation and efficiency. Individuals who are interested in becoming a SAR volunteer should contact their local, non-profit SAR society for recruitment dates, training requirements, and time commitment details. All new SAR volunteers will be subject to a criminal records check and review.

### Yukon Amateur Radio Association (YARA)

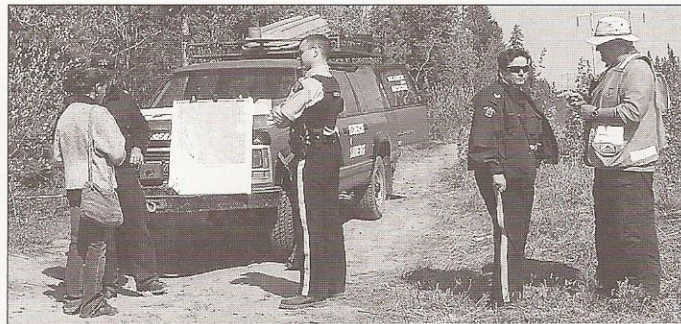

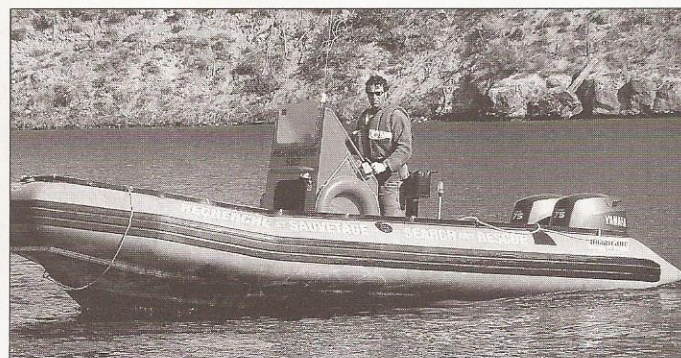
Gord Reed and Olivier Pellegrin work on arm splinting



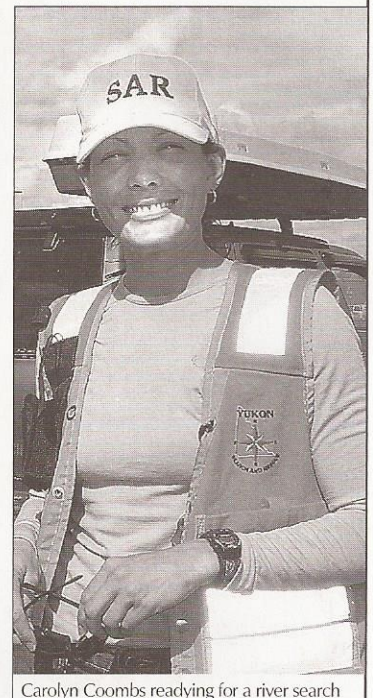
Eric Albertini prepares for a river search
